2025



I BELIEVE THAT EVEN IN THE MOST DIFFICULT SITUATIONS, THERE CAN AND SHOULD BE ROOM FOR PLAY, LAUGHTER, AND FRIENDSHIP.

This is what the story of Amigos is about: a community of university students who bring the power of friendship into hospitals by offering their time and attention, helping to bring childhood back to places where it is often overshadowed by illness. In 2025, we were present in 6 cities and 21 hospital units, visiting children 55 times a week, with each visit aimed at making their time in hospital a little easier.

The results of the past year have reinforced our belief that personal presence is truly essential. In 2025, we held 1994 sessions and reached 2785 children—a 36% increase compared to the previous year. In addition, we launched new programs to reach children we are not yet able to visit in person: through our online initiatives and Amigo-days, we were able to connect with children in additional cities and settings. We believe that every single encounter matters—whether it takes place in a hospital room, in an online space, or through a carefully prepared gift package.

None of this would be possible without the **Amigos community** and our supporters. In 2025, we could rely on **267** volunteers in the spring and **277** volunteers in the autumn, who not only supported children week after week, but also actively shaped Amigos: they developed learning materials, organized events, contributed to fundraising and communications, and continued to **build a value-driven community** where helping others and personal development go hand in hand. For us, these results are not just numbers—each one represents a story. **A child who laughed again, experienced a sense of choice, made new friends, discovered a new language, or simply felt a little less alone.**

We are deeply grateful to our supporters, who contribute to our work in many different ways and make it possible for us to move closer - day by day - to our goal that **one day there would be an Amigo by every hospitalized child's side.** Thank you for being part of this journey—we look forward to continuing it together in 2026!

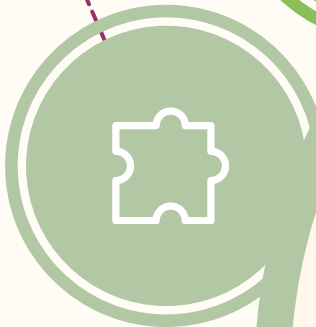

THAT'S WHY WE ARE THERE

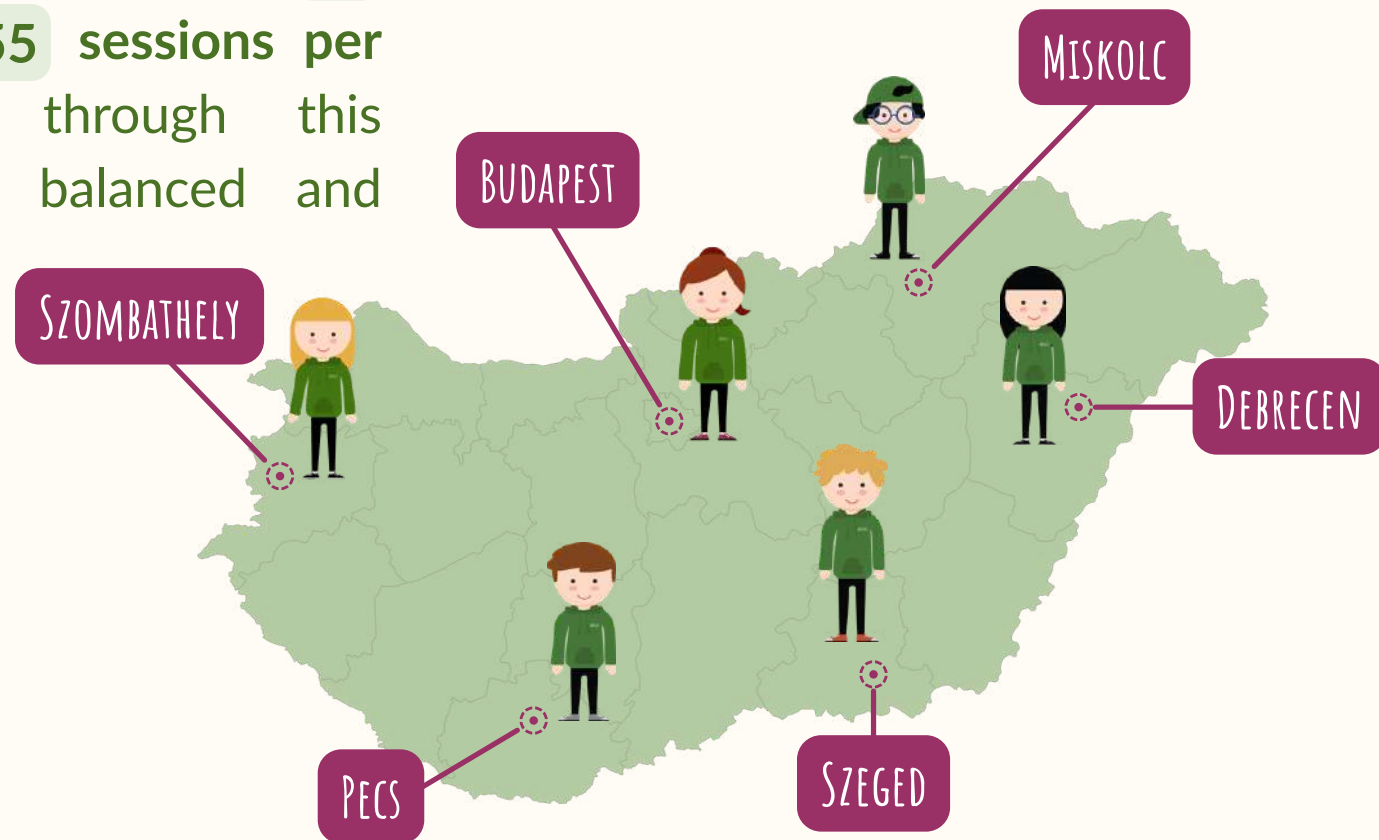


Amigo-sessions provide real support for children in this vulnerable situation. During our visits, our main goal is to help them forget about the hospital environment and their illness, and to feel like children again—thereby we also support their healing process. The best way to achieve this is through play, into which we can naturally incorporate language learning as well, since our aim is also to support children's development in line with their age and current condition.

RELIABLE PERSONAL VISITS

In 2025, our university student volunteers, the Amigos, regularly visited hospitalized children week after week in **6 cities: Budapest, Szeged, Debrecen, Szombathely, Pécs, and Miskolc.**

Visits took place in a total of **21 hospital units, with 55 sessions per week**, contributing through this consistency to more balanced and predictable days for children in hospital.





During their **in-person visits**, Amigo volunteers supported a total of **2785** children, which at times meant one-on-one **language learning** sessions with teenagers, and often involved **playing in a group** with several children in the ward. Through our gifting initiatives, the number of children whose recovery was brightened by Amigos increased to **17 677**.

2025: A YEAR OF NEW INITIATIVES

In 2025, we not only expanded our range of own developed tools but also created new in-person and online programs. This year, Amigo volunteers developed a conversation-based card game, *Partvonal*, as well as a coloring booklet, called *Szó-kincsek*, for preschool-aged children. We also launched a new initiative called *Amigo-days*, with the aim of reaching children in smaller hospitals where we are not yet regularly present. Throughout the year, we organized **19** Amigo-days across **13** cities, reaching **116** children.

We developed new online programs and relaunched some of our earlier ones. Besides *Kalandor*, *Amigos Extra* and *Világutazó*, our e-learning materials supporting language learning are also available on kalandozz.amigos.hu, along with our video series “*Mi leszek, ha nagy leszek?*”, which helps children with career orientation.



Our volunteers support children across a wide range of hospital departments, including oncology, orthopedics, neurology, rehabilitation, child and adolescent psychiatry, surgery, pediatric cardiology, and internal medicine.

In 2025, we expanded our hospital presence with 2 new hospital teams. In Budapest, we began our regular visits in the Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Department at Semmelweis University First Department of Pediatrics. We also expanded our presence at Markusovszky University Teaching Hospital in Szombathely by the number of Amigos hospital teams on the pediatric ward to two.

HOSPITAL-BASED EVENTS AND CAMPS

In 2025, we also took part in family days and community events organized by our partner hospitals. We participated in the **National Hospital Sports Day** hosted by **Bethesda Children's Hospital**, as well as the annual **Tour de Bókay** charity event organized by **Semmelweis University Department of Pediatrics**.

At both events, we organized activities for children that highlighted the connection between **sports** and

foreign languages, encouraging them to learn through play and movement.

In addition, this year we held **5 Amigo-sessions** across **3 camps** organized for children. Our volunteers led **playful, educational activities** at the rehabilitation camp of **Bethesda Children's Hospital** in April and August, and at the neurology camp in August.

As in previous years, we took part in the **Children's Day** celebration organized by the Semmelweis University Department of Pediatrics. Alongside the festivities, Amigo volunteers organized **crafts activities** for the children staying in the hospital.



BY THEIR SIDE DURING HOLIDAYS AS WELL

In 2025, we once again prepared themed craft boxes to bring a festive atmosphere into hospital rooms.

Whether it was **Easter**, **Children's Day**, **Halloween**, or **Christmas**, children enthusiastically engaged in creative activities. Our craft boxes were designed by a small group of Amigo volunteers, called the **creative hospital team**, who always ensure that each box not only fosters creativity but also **supports language learning**.





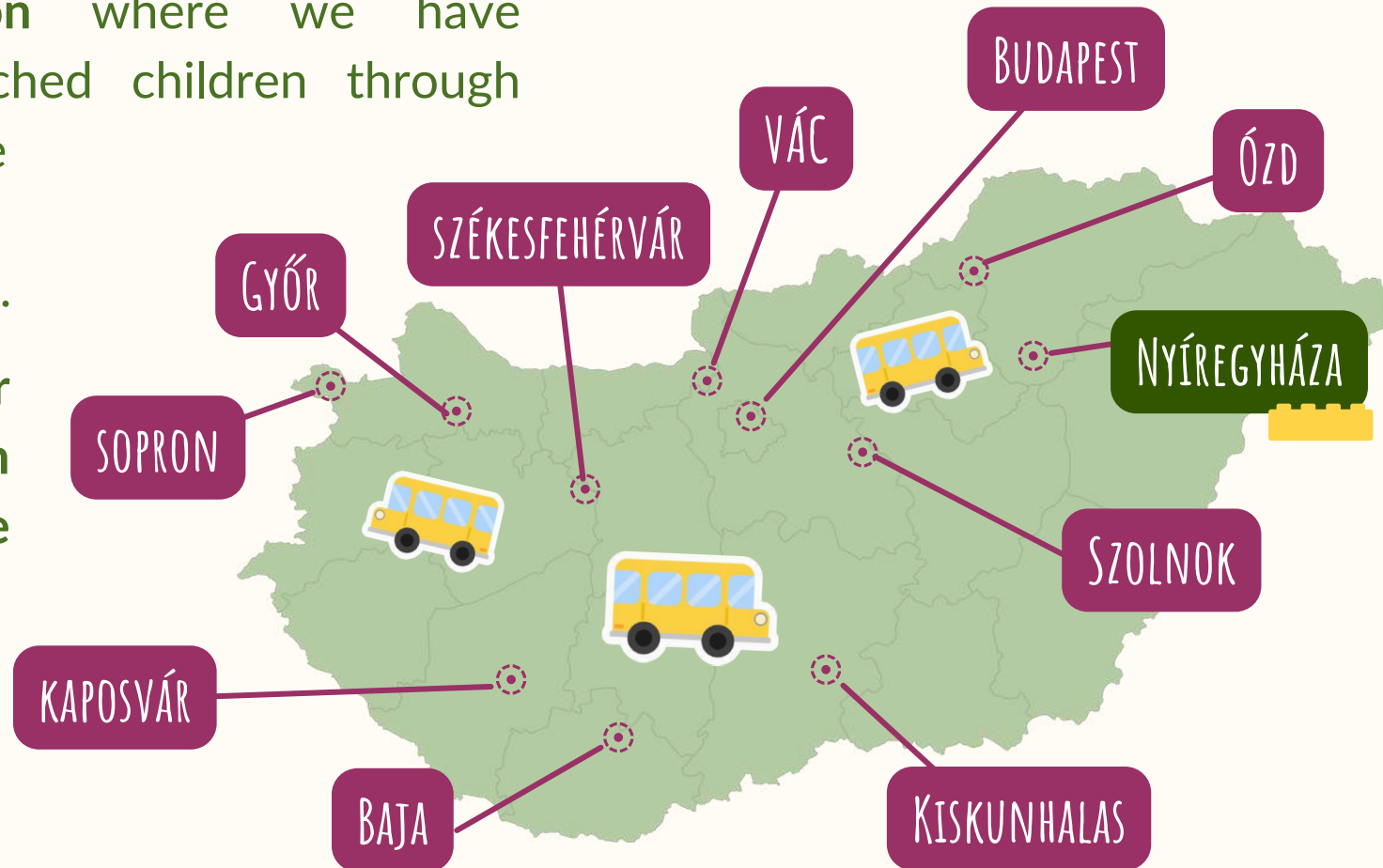
At the end of the year, Amigo volunteers prepared interactive Christmas shows combined with playful language learning in 4 hospitals, bringing the true magic of the holiday season to 100 children staying in hospital.

PERSONAL VISITS BEYOND THE 6 CITIES

We launched our new initiative in the spring of 2025, the **Amigo-days**.

The aim of the program is to allow us to **visit hospitals in person** where we have previously only reached children through donations without the opportunity to create personal connections.

Thanks to our collaboration with the LEGO, we were able to hold **5 Amigo-days** in Nyíregyháza.



Within the framework of the **Amigo-days**, teams from each **Amigo city** traveled to nearby towns to surprise children with games, gifts, and a short performance, celebrating Easter in the spring and Santa Claus in late autumn.



OUR SOCIAL IMPACT

At the core of our theory of social impact is the belief that **children should be able to remain children even in hospital**—learning, playing, and spending meaningful time with their friends. During our sessions, children can **learn languages**, reduce their academic gaps, and build new friendships with our university student volunteers as well as strengthen their motivation and self-confidence.

Beyond the impact on children, we have also begun to explore how

Amigo volunteers are affected by the experiences gained in hospitals and within our community.

In our impact measurement project, which examines both children and volunteers, we identified a shared key insight: both groups benefit from feeling that **there is a supportive community behind them when they face challenges**.

Our results show that more than $\frac{2}{3}$ of children already experience a positive change after their very first session.

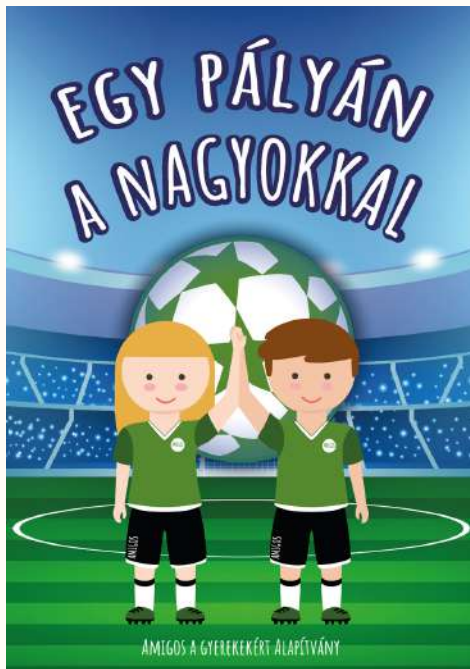


In 2025, we distributed **2489** workbooks during our hospital sessions and donated them to **49** healthcare institutions across **Hungary**, enabling children to explore the stories and challenges featured in the workbooks, even in places where Amigo volunteers are not yet present in person.



OUR RANGE OF OWN DEVELOPED TOOLS HAS EXPANDED

By 2025, we had developed **15** original workbooks to support children's language learning. This year, we added **3** new workbooks to our hospital activity boxes

We also developed a new activity booklet called **Szó-kincsek**, featuring a wide variety of themed coloring pages and fun, educational puzzles designed to engage children while supporting their development.

In addition, we now engage children with **4** different card games developed in-house. Our newest game, **Partvonal**, is particularly effective in involving children who play or are interested in sports.



GIFTS ALL OVER THE COUNTRY

ADVENTURE BOX

Although we are not yet able to be present in every pediatric hospital across Hungary, we are committed to **supporting children recovering beyond the cities where Amigos operates**. One way we do this is through the **Adventure Box initiative**. In 2025, we distributed a total of **2500 Adventure Boxes to 35 institutions**, bringing the Amigos experience to children who otherwise would not have the opportunity to benefit from it.

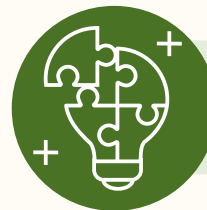

In 2025, **2** versions were distributed similarly to the previous year—one for kindergarten-aged, and one for school-aged children—each tailored to the needs and abilities of its respective age group.

Children can use the learning box either together with an Amigo or independently. Altogether, the activities included in the box provide **more than 15** hours of playful learning.

GIFTS ALL OVER THE COUNTRY

LEGO Build to Give campaign

Another way we brought joy to children was through the **LEGO Build to Give campaign**, which was organized twice again this year.

To celebrate Children's Day, we delivered a total of **6204** LEGO sets to **55** hospitals. During the Christmas season, we brought festive cheer to the pediatric wards of **65** hospitals with **4197** LEGO sets and more than **4500** gifts produced by Amigos. Altogether, we were able to brighten the recovery journey of more than **10 000** children during some of their most difficult days.

The donated toys were intended to give these children a chance to **experience a little of what an Amigo-session is like**, while also bringing joy to those spending the holidays in hospital.

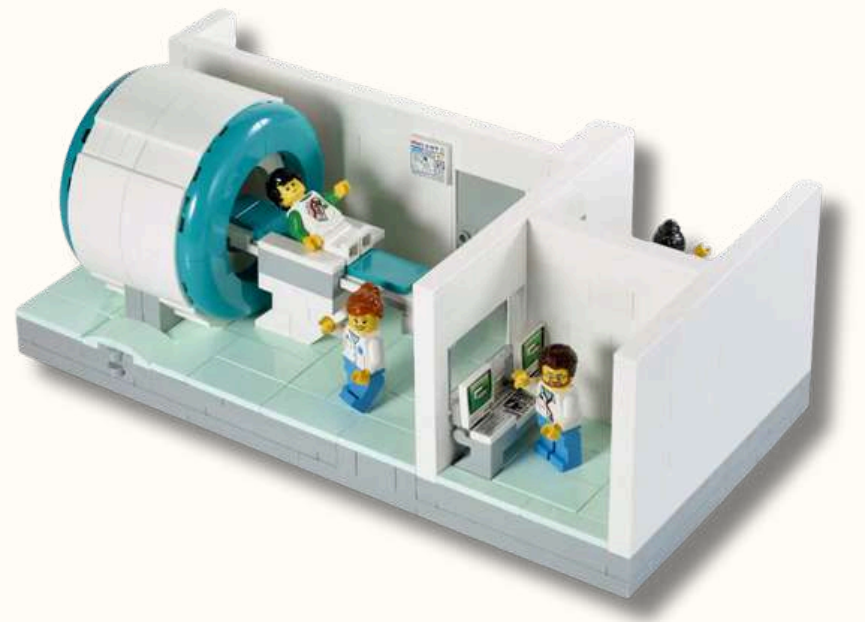
LEGO MRI Scanner sets

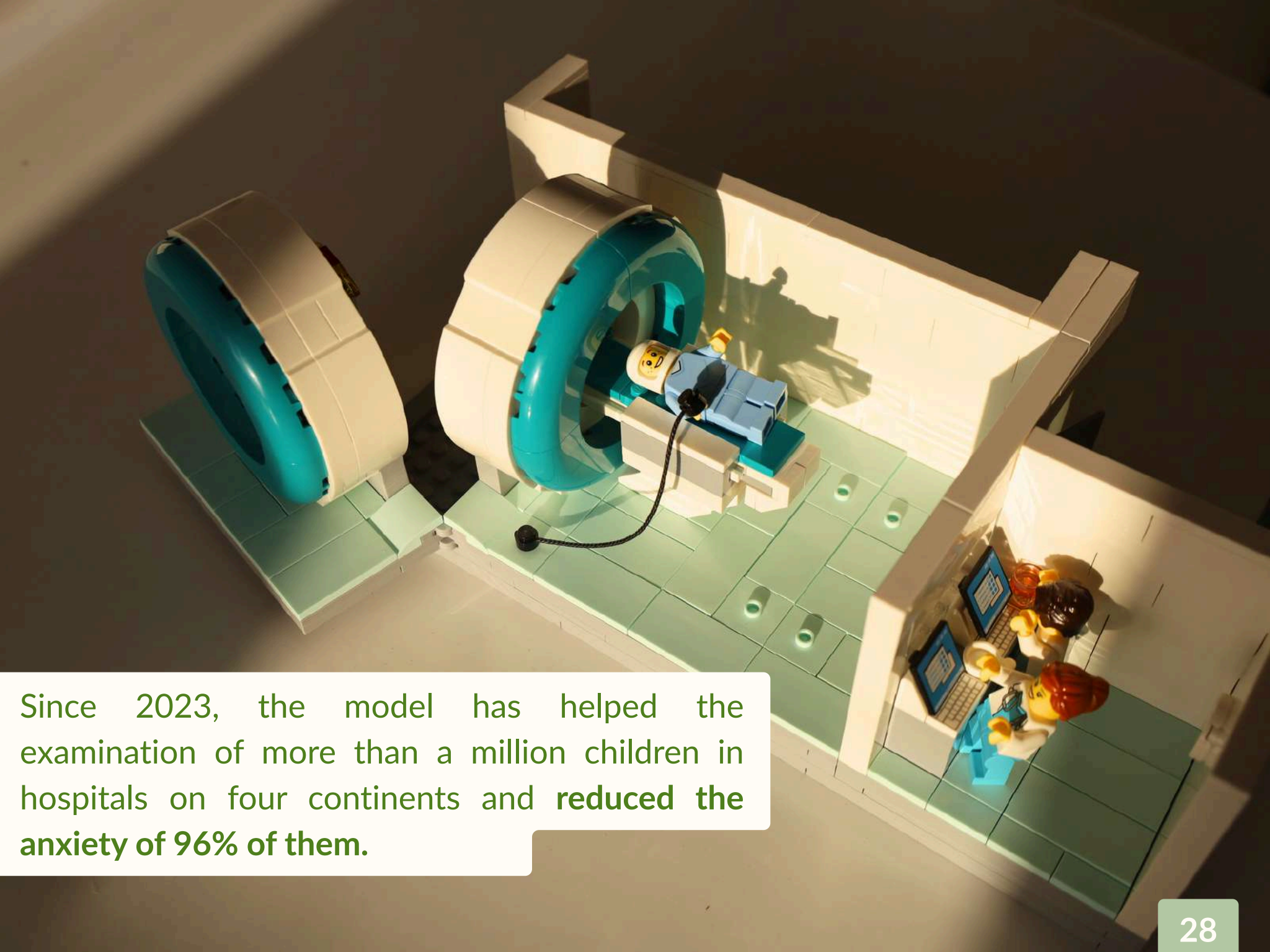
In 2025, we complemented our gifting initiatives with a special sub-project in which, exceptionally, the recipients were not children but healthcare professionals.

Thanks to the **LEGO** team, we distributed **LEGO MRI Scanner sets** to **10** healthcare institutions. These sets are designed to help children become familiar with the MRI procedure through play, reducing

anxiety and fear before their examination.

The sets also include online resources that help professionals communicate with children.





Since 2023, the model has helped the examination of more than a million children in hospitals on four continents and **reduced the anxiety of 96% of them.**

SESSIONS IN THE ONLINE SPACE

As part of the **UniCredit Foundation** grant, in 2025 we focused not only on hospital visits but also on **providing support for adolescents (aged 11–18) recovering at home.**

In 2025, we revisited and further developed the online platforms **Kalandor** and **Amigos Extra**, which had proven successful during the COVID pandemic, and also worked on developing new programs.

In the fall, we launched the **Világutazó** program in person in three hospital wards, where children explored different cultures together with the Amigos. We also delivered **200** workbook packages to hospitals where we were not yet able to be present in person, enabling children to take part in the program independently and at their own pace.

In addition, we have developed our own e-learning platform, kalandozz.amigos.hu, the design of which, as well as the creation of the existing learning materials, was supported by an **Alumni Amigo**, **Ágnes Fábián**, in the role of expertmentor. On this continuously expanding platform, a variety of engaging learning materials are available to support language learning and career orientation.





KALANDOR: Free online language expedition for 11-14 year-olds, where we learn about the culture, language and gastronomy of foreign countries together.

AMIGOS EXTRA: Free online co-learning with Amigo volunteers in various subjects for ages 11-18.



MI LESZEK, HA NAGY LESZEK?: Introducing 12 professions to hospitalized or recovering teens who are about to choose career paths. It provides deeper insight into the professions through the tasks associated with them.



VILÁGUTAZÓ: A language expedition for 11-16 year olds, where they can learn about the culture and language of different countries through workbooks during hospital sessions or independently with a workbook package.



UniCredit Foundation places great emphasis on **knowledge sharing** among supported organizations, so **we participated in their annual conference**, the main topic of which was the **vulnerability of civil society organizations**. During the two days, we were able to brainstorm and share good practices with other participating organizations on topics such as preserving the mental health of helpers and the difficulties of educational programs.



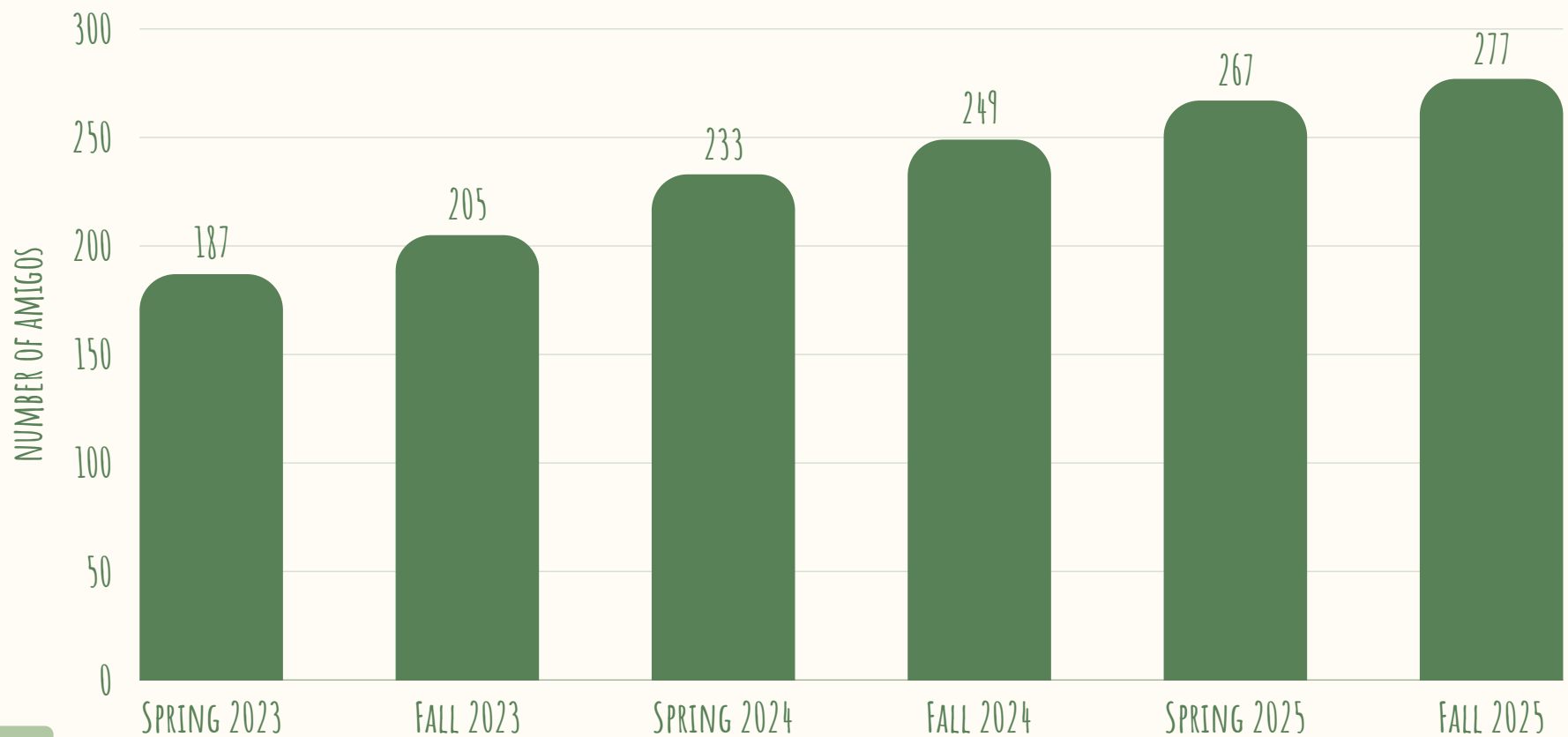

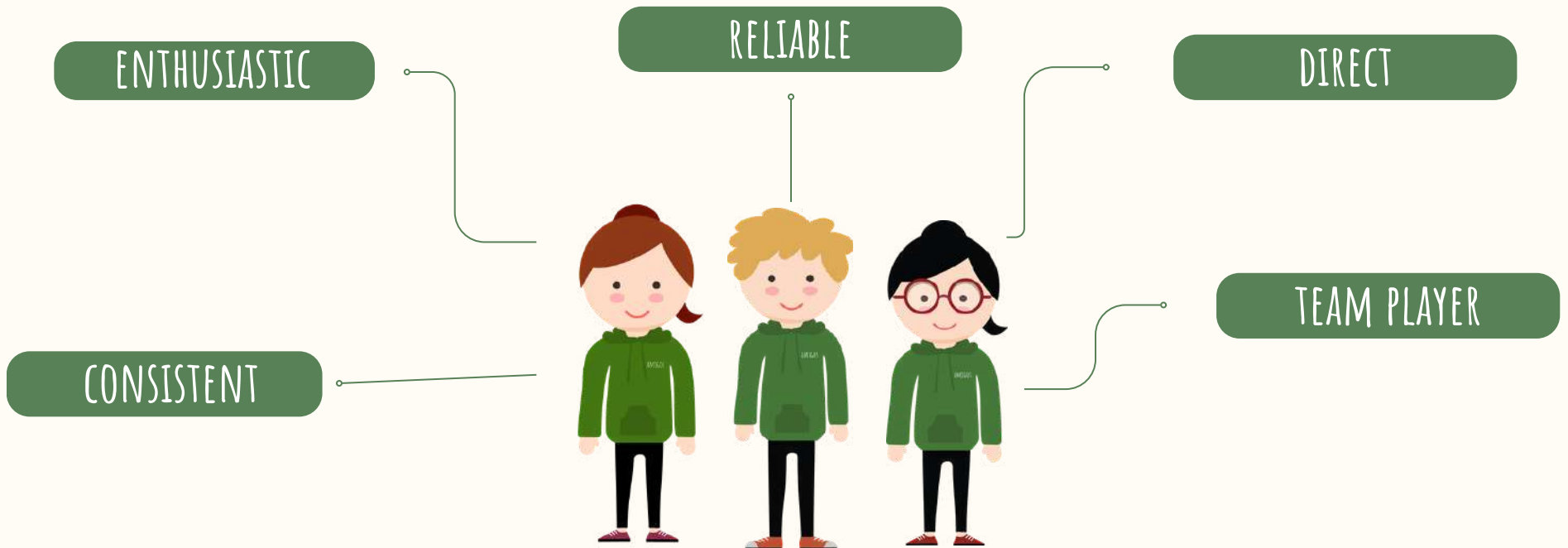


EVERY AMIGO IS VALUABLE TO US

The basis of our organization is formed by the **university volunteers, the Amigos, who visit the hospitals.** Without them, the Foundation would not be able to function. By the fall of 2025, a total of **277** Amigo volunteers had visited children in hospital.



WHAT CHARACTERIZES AN AMIGO VOLUNTEER?



We recruit new volunteers once a semester, when we all work together to select the most suitable candidates for our team.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OF OUR VOLUNTEERS

Before starting their hospital work, every Amigo volunteer participates in a full-day training course called **Amigo School**, where our experienced volunteers show them the process of the sessions, what situations children may face in hospitals and how to respond to them correctly. In addition, child protection, Amigo-values, child developmental psychology and the operation of the foundation are discussed. And, of course, team building is also part of the training.



In addition, we organize **Amigos Academy sessions** several times each semester, the purpose of which is to ensure that our volunteers are as prepared as possible for their volunteer work. We therefore also cover up-to-date topics with the help of our Alumni volunteers or external experts:

Zsuzsanna Dér-Pesics, clinical and pedagogical psychologist and integrative child therapist, gave a presentation on **fairy tale therapy** and how our Amigo volunteers can incorporate storytelling into hospital sessions.

Györgyi Bokor-Bacsák, a special education teacher and the professional leader of Egy sima egy fordított - Egyesület az Inklúzióért, talked to our volunteers about **children with disabilities** and how to connect with them and involve them in play and learning during hospital sessions.

Zsuzsa Tóth, special education teacher, family therapist and professional manager of the Bárányfelhő Development and Therapy Center, talked to our Amigo volunteers about **grief**, its understanding and processing.

But our most important community-building professional event every year is our **Professional Camp**, traditionally organized at the end of the summer. Here, in addition to team-building programs, experts provide training for volunteers on a wide variety of topics so that we can help children as prepared as possible.



PROFESSIONAL CAMP

Organizational transparency and teamwork are very important principles for us, therefore the goal of the **board of trustees workshop** held at our **professional camp** was to strengthen the relationship between the Amigos employees and the volunteers.

We also consider it important to involve our volunteers in issues of **organizational development**, so we discussed our **online programs** together in a workshop.

In addition, our volunteers also attended interesting **lectures** given by trained professionals, including **connecting with children and adolescents in state care**.



VOLUNTEERS ARE NOT ALONE WHEN IT'S HARD

During hospital visits, our volunteers often encounter emotionally stressful situations. That is why we pay special attention to ensuring that every Amigo has the opportunity to seek professional help if they need it. Our **psychologist safety net** provides supportive conversations for Amigos. This support covers both the difficulties experienced during hospital activities and the challenges regarding the community.

The goal of the safety net is to preserve the mental well-being of Amigos and support them in coping with any difficulties. The professional help for this has been provided for the second year in a row by the psychologists of **Mindset Psychology**.



HOW ARE YOU FEELING?



Our volunteers also participate in **monthly intervision sessions**, so-called **Hospital Meetings**, where hospital teams come together and discuss their experiences in the hospital. Here, Amigo volunteers have the opportunity to share both their positive and difficult hospital experiences in a safe atmosphere.

PSYCHOEDUCATIONAL DAYS AND CAMP

In order to support the mental well-being of our volunteers, we organized our annual **Psychoeducational Camp** again, and this year we also held city-level **Psychoeducational Days**, for the first time, in order to create the opportunity for even more volunteers to process hospital and community topics related to volunteering. In the spring semester, **self-awareness-focused workshops** were held in **5** cities on topics such as **lack of motivation, burnout, and relaxation.**

Most volunteers hold hospital sessions for children over several semesters, so it is important that they acquire tools that make emotionally stressful situations manageable.



In 2025, we organized a **three-day psychoeducational camp** in **Pilisszántó**. On the first day, the participants got to know each other through team-building programs, and during the weekend, Alumni Amigo volunteers held small group sessions, during which they explored the topic of **resilience**.



WE ARE A STRONG COMMUNITY OF FRIENDS

In order to build trust and **friendship** between volunteers, we place great emphasis on **building community** through various programs, as this is essential for **teamwork**, **fun hospital sessions**, and for Amigo volunteers to be able to count on each other. Because it is important that **we are not only the children's**, but **also each other's friends**.

During the monthly **Amigo-nights** the volunteers organize a variety of themed programs in each city, such as karaoke nights, laser tag, communal baking, or picnics.

This year, **AmiGOES** took place again, when Amigo volunteers from one of the Amigo-cities host volunteers from other cities. In 2025, **Miskolc** hosted volunteers and showed them the city.

We once again organized a multi-day **End-of-year camp** at **Lake Balaton**, where we celebrated the successes of the previous semester and volunteers from 6 different cities could meet each other.

We also had a **Sports Month** during the summer, in which more than **100 Amigo volunteers** participated and collected more than **8,000 km** together. There was a **joint bike ride around Lake Velence**, a **joint hike**, and a **canoe trip** as well.

In October, we celebrated **Amigos' 11th birthday**, where active and Alumni Amigo volunteers from the 6 cities could celebrate the successes and joys of the past year together.

That is why the **Mentor Alumni Team** was founded, within the framework of which **30 Mentor Alumni** helped with resource creation, online curriculum development, participation in professional conferences, and psychoeducation.

PadThai supported the work of the Amigos community, among other things, by creating and selling charity bracelets.

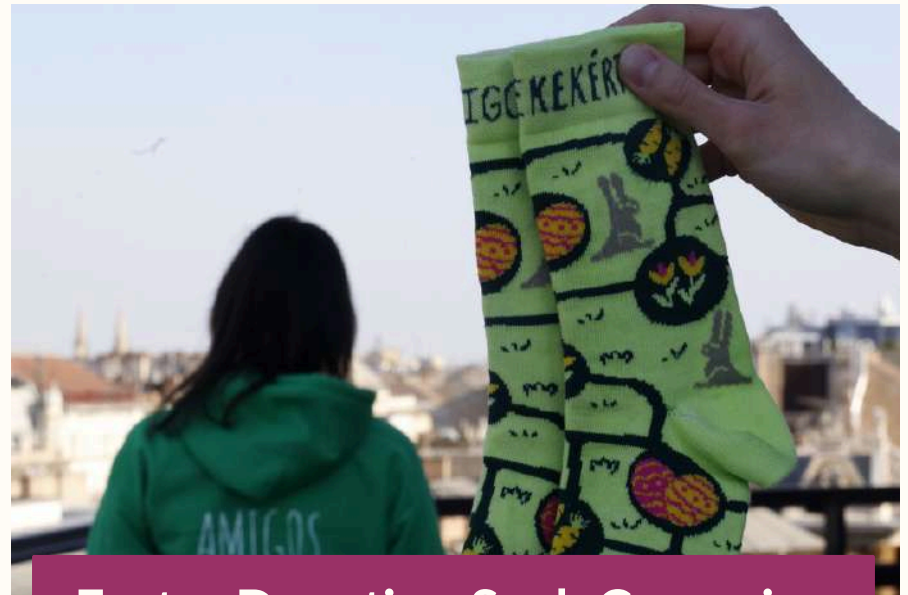

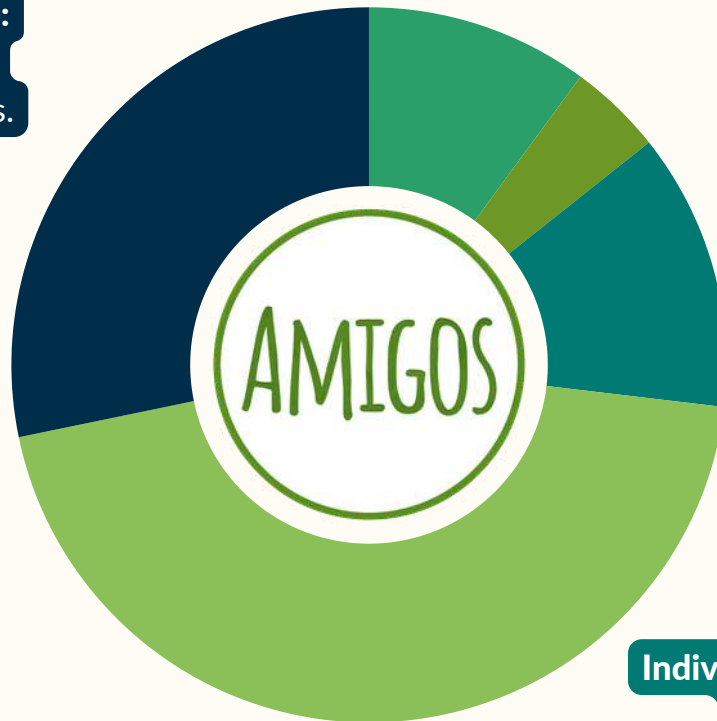

Interest income from fixed deposits, sales of products with the Amigos logo.

Restricted-use corporate subsidies (44.9%):
Corporate support provided to cover specific costs or support obtained through a tender.

Private donations (12.6%):
Individual donors (regular/one-time), private donations, including the 1% campaign.

We strive to ensure that the Foundation's activities remain sustainable in the long term, therefore, during our management, we create an operating reserve to maintain stable operations. This allows us to respond to unexpected situations, such as the Covid pandemic, during which we did not have to introduce restrictions on the Foundation's activities on economic grounds.

OUR TOTAL EXPENSES: 214.2 MILLION HUF

Operating wages (22.1%):

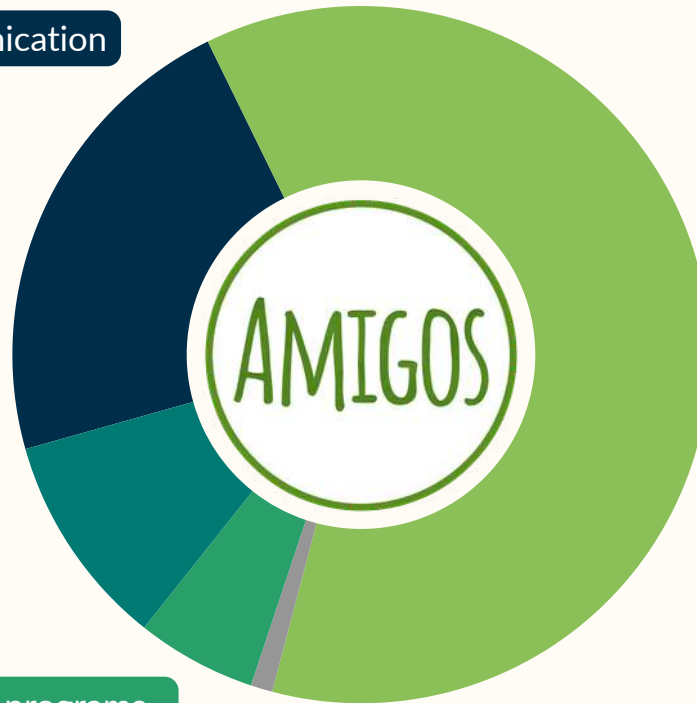
Annual salary and contribution costs of our employees responsible for operations, administration, fundraising and communication and management.

Operation (9.9%):

Postage, logistics, accounting, VAT, telephone bill, bank charges, website costs, tangible assets, office costs, other operating costs.

Volunteer community (5.6%):

Camps, admissions, gifts, training, other programs, tools organized for Amigo volunteers, which aim to build, maintain and develop the community. This also includes expenses related to non-Amigo volunteers (e.g. office volunteers, packing helpers, advisory volunteers).



Helping children (61.4%):

(direct costs of our mission)

Games, supplies for classes, hospital boxes, contact cards, volunteer name cards, therapist costs that arose in connection with our main activity, our other projects, such as Adventure box (KALANDobOZZ), donation of LEGO sets, Amigos book. This also includes the salary costs of the staff organizing our core activity.

Marketing and communication (1.0%):

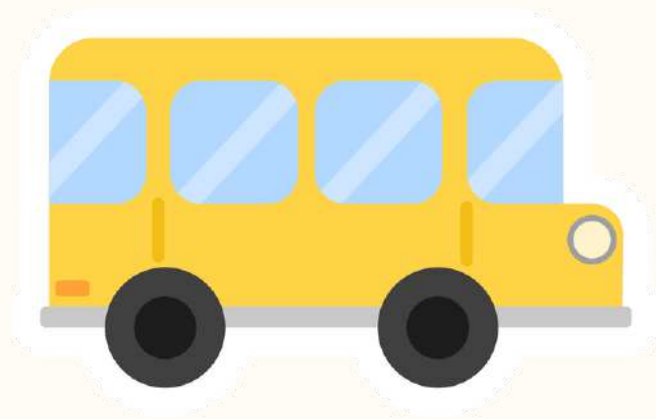
Online and offline advertisements, publications, merchandise.
